**Triumviratum
Barolo, D.O.C.G., Michele Chiarlo**

The triumvirate was the form of government in Rome under the three Caesars. The name pays homage to the union of the three "kings" of Barolo. It is blended from small lots of Nebbiolo grapes from Michele Chiarlo's vineyards in Barolo's three most prestigious crus: **Cannubi, Brunate and Cerequio.**

The Cannubi vineyard, in the commune of Barolo overlooking the town, is comprised of five plots with a collective area of just under 85 acres. Michele Chiarlo returned his vineyard in this cru to production by creating the first terraced cultivation in the Langhe.

The Brunate vineyard lies along the southern boundary of the commune of La Morra, adjacent to the cru of Cerequio, and spills slightly into the adjoining commune of Barolo at the bottom of the slope. Michele Chiarlo holds a long-term contract over a 2.25-acre parcel in Brunate replanted in 1991. The plot yields an extremely small quantity of exceptionally fine, concentrated berries which consistently reach a superb level of maturity by benefit of the vineyard's perfect exposure.

Cerequio, situated in the communes of La Morra and Barolo, is consistently and universally considered to be one of the greatest and most prestigious crus of the Langhe. Michele Chiarlo is proprietor of 15 of a total of 45 acres in the Cerequio vineyard planted in 1972, which he has cultivated directly since 1987. The vines are consistently pruned, thinned and minimally treated to ensure a restricted yield and fruit of great concentration and quality.
