Aromas of wood smoke and mild Alpine cheese on this wine are intense and likely to be divisive. Those who take the plunge will be rewarded with a zingy, refreshing sip redolent of Granny Smith apples. For a Pinot Gris from the region, this wine has big body, but it's kept in check by pulsing acidity. That smoky note returns on the finish, but now with a juicy, tangy punch.
